Maryborough Education Centre is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of their parent payment arrangements for 2021.

Maryborough Education Centre makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents.

Maryborough Education Centre has removed the Shared Resource Pool amounts in 2020 and this will continue to be deleted for 2021. MEC has been constantly reviewing other charges to remove and to this end we are introducing digital text books and programs where possible to ensure all students have access to online learning platforms.

Financial Support for Families

Maryborough Education Centre understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund for those eligible families
- Second hand options e.g. school uniform bank
- State Schools Relief – contact Student Services coordinator (Jessica Malham Years 7 – 12), Specialist Wellbeing Officer (Caitlin Thompson) and Primary Welfare Officer (Elana Stoklahsa Years Prep – 6)
- Local community support groups as required; e.g. Salvation Army, St Luke's etc.

Payment Methods

- Payment plan arrangements will be used for those families who request this outside the instalment options that are currently available.
- The processes for meeting/communicating with parents experiencing hardship, including information to be provided will be delivered by our Student Services coordinator at Years 7 – 12, Family Liaison Officer (whole school), Specialist Wellbeing Officer and our Primary Welfare Officer at Years P – 6. All of these staff are trained in managing these situations

discretely and effectively. The staff will consider proactive strategies to engage with parents disconnected from the school who may be experiencing hardship, such as discretely approaching families who may need support and special payment arrangements.

- A welfare fund has been established by MEC for families in need. Our Student Services team has been given the authority to use this as necessary
